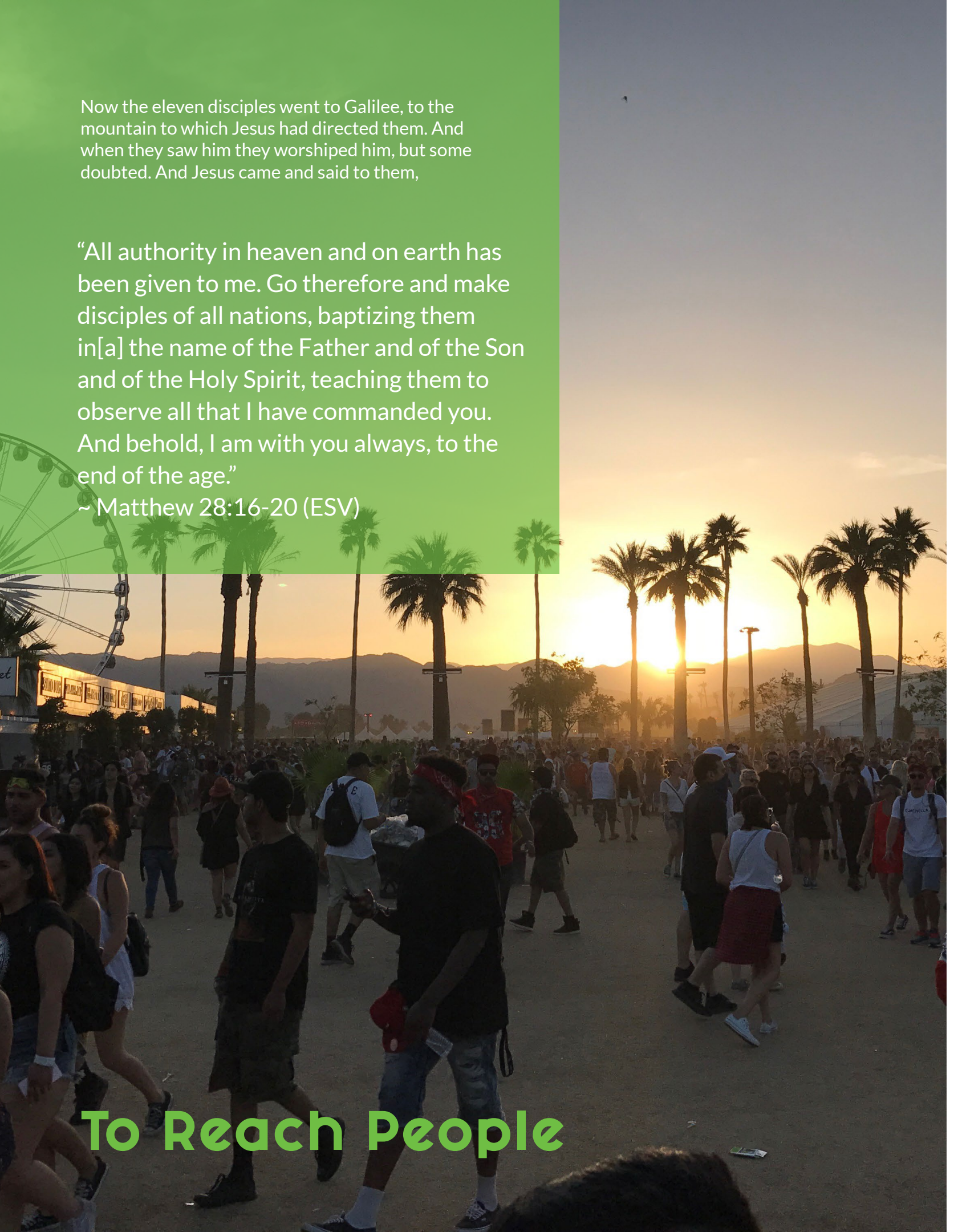
Our Savior's Five Year Plan

We envision an ever-growing community who are passionately committed to a life of prayer, a body of believers desperate to reach and to be in relationship with the pre-believers and de-churched in all corners of our community and world in order to bring them into a transforming relationship with Jesus Christ. We want to redefine what it means to "belong" to Our Savior's Palm Springs, moving everyone closer to Jesus—from passive consumers to active and passionate followers. WE WILL BE DISCIPLES WHO MAKE DISCIPLES.

Organized around our mission "Living the love of Jesus," our specific goals, values and initiatives over the next five years are summarized in the following pages and outlined in more detail in the addendum document. It is important to note that the primary strategic emphasis will be the development of disciples—for this reason, this goal should be understood as our first priority in the allocation of time and resources and will begin with a focus on families with school age children.

To put it simply, we will be a church that fulfills Jesus' command to make disciples. This means there is an understood expectation among us that Our Savior's Palm Springs is about making disciples who live by God's grace through faith and lead lives guided by His Word. We will celebrate the growth we witness in people's lives—stories will be told and glory will be given to God. Our heroes will be those who are equipping others to lead lives based more fully on God's Word and sharing the love of Christ with others.

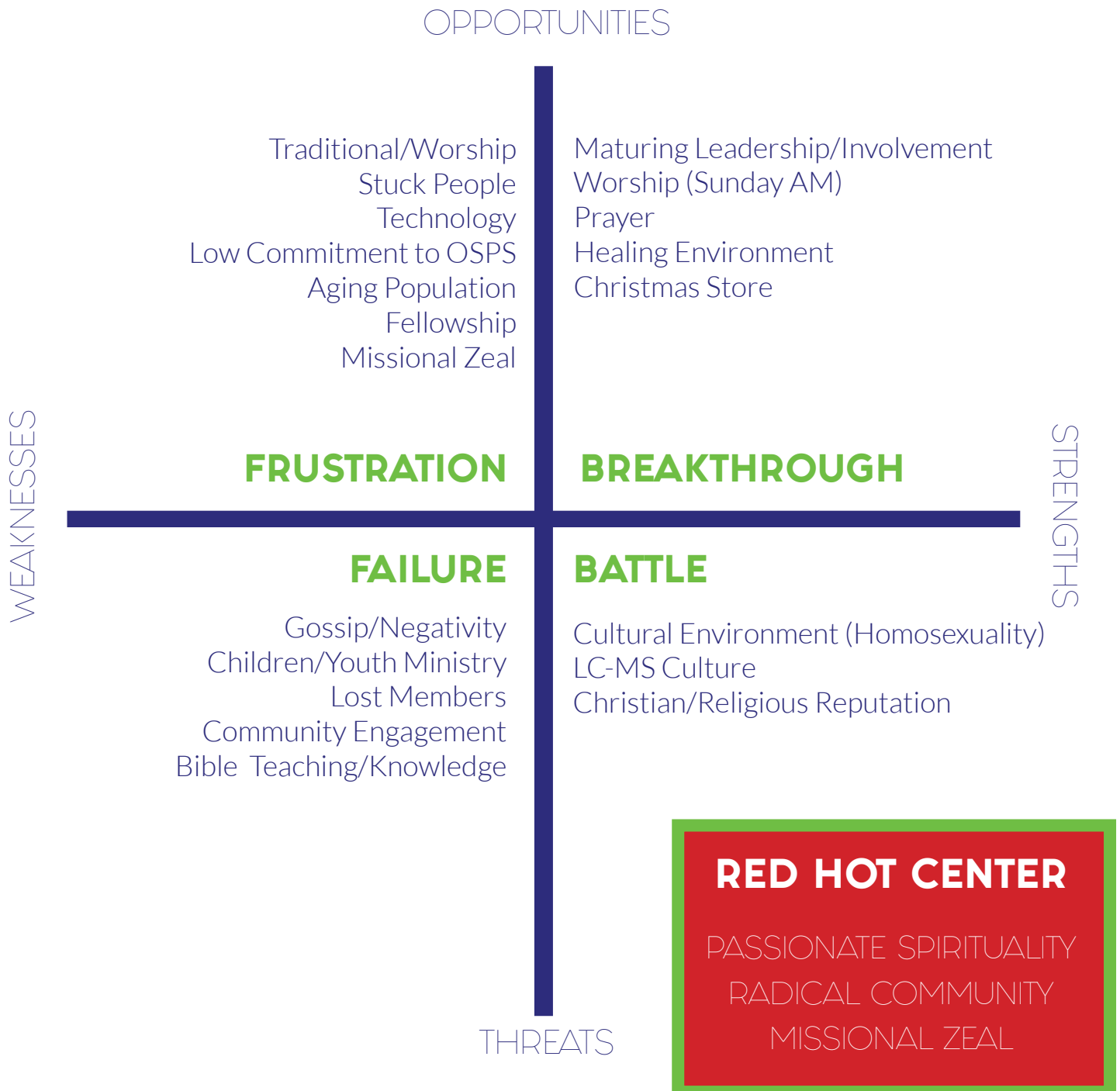

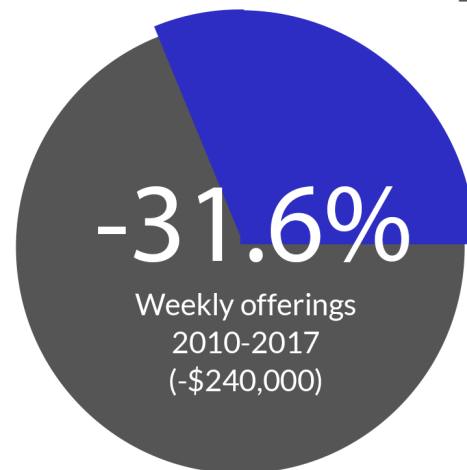
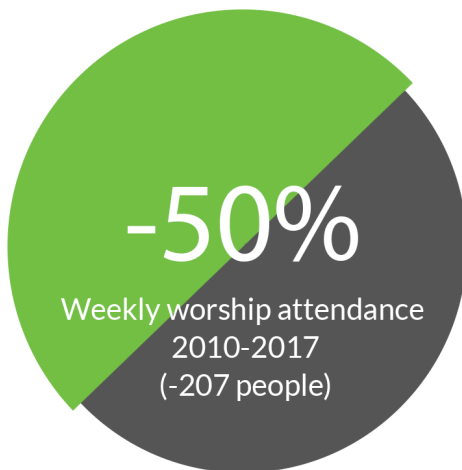
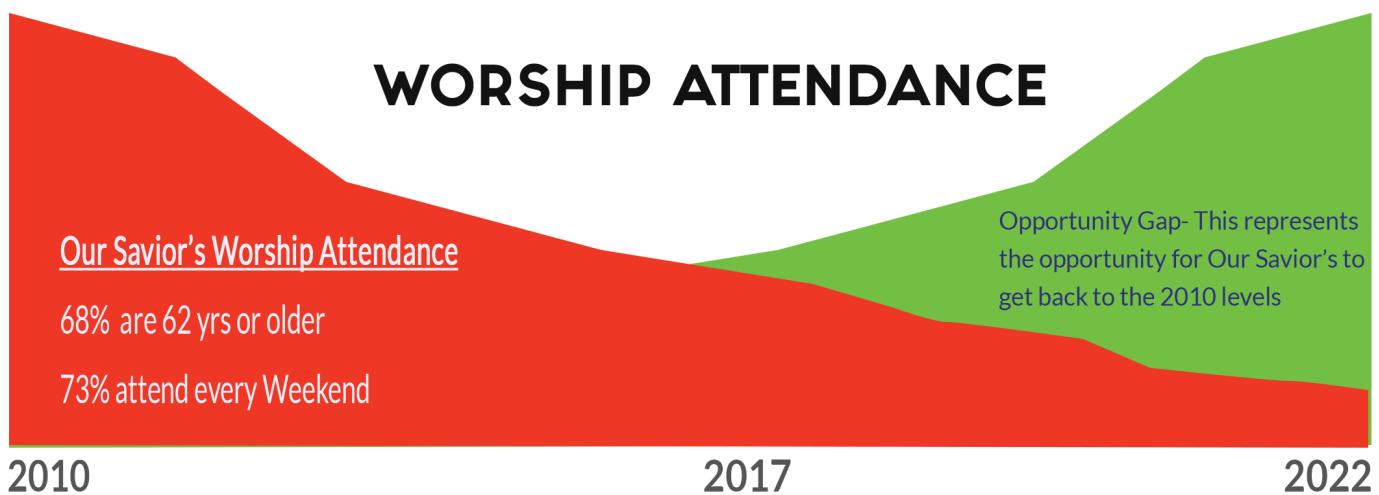


NUMBERS

OUR CURRENT SITUATION CAN BE SUMMED UP BY JUST A FEW NUMBERS THAT ARE USED AS LEADING INDICATORS OF HEALTH.

OVER THE LAST 7 YEARS OUR SAVIOR'S HAS SEEN A DRASTIC DECLINE IN ALL AREAS OF ITS MINISTRY. TWO TRADITIONAL MEASURES OF CHURCH HEALTH ARE WORSHIP ATTENDANCE AND WEEKLY OFFERINGS. IN BOTH OF THESE MEASURES THERE HAS BEEN STEEP DECLINES THAT ARE AFFECTING THE OVERALL MINISTRY EFFECTIVENESS. BELOW ARE SOME OF THE ACTUAL NUMBERS FROM 2010-2017:

Church Doctor Report Findings

61% of leaders would like to make outreach to un-churched people a high priority. 39% of survey respondents agreed.

33% of survey respondents and 35% of newcomers to Our Savior's became aware of the church through friends/relatives/spouse.

Optimistic Future

54% of the survey respondents stated that the greatest era of the church will be in the next 10 years. 60% of the leaders agree that the greatest era of the church will be in the next 10 years!

- *Intentionally freeing our OSPS family to engage in our communities.*
- *Equipping people to see themselves as having "sacramental" impact/presence.*
- *Being a place where the "community" can safely explore the faith.*

Relevance through Forward Thinking: applying Biblical truth to current reality in a relevant way.

Demonstrated by:

- *Crafting the ancient truth of Scripture into a modern context.*

- *Preparing disciples to engage societal issues and trends where we live, work, and play.*
- *A willingness to risk and try new things to reach new people.*

Action through Faith: We live the love of Jesus in all areas of our life, developing faith in the environment of family, engaging people at all ages in the journey of faith.

Demonstrated by:

- *Seeing each other as part of a larger extended spiritual family on mission.*
- *Viewing ourselves as sacraments that bring the care and love of Jesus everywhere we go.*
- *Equipping all generations to live as disciples who make disciples.*
- *Sharing, telling and celebrating stories of past, present, and future.*

Acceptance through Authenticity: We bring restoration to the broken by loving them as Christ loved us.

Demonstrated by:

- *Speaking the truth in love, with gentleness and respect.*
- *Creating environments where everyone and anyone feels welcome.*
- *Recognizing that our identity in Christ affects the manner in which we interact with others, acknowledging our own sinfulness and biases.*
- *Embodying the love, humility and grace of Jesus, while embracing a life of joy, fun, and celebration.*

Growth Through Generosity: All growth, physical and spiritual, is accomplished through the generosity of God and his people. As a response to his love and grace, we live lives that are generous.

Demonstrated by:

- *Viewing all that we have as God's possession and leverage for the Kingdom.*
- *Generosity to our family and friends, to our enemies, and to the un-churched/de-churched.*
- *Our commitment to eliminate debt in order that we might reallocate our resources to reach the community with Jesus' love.*
- *Budgeting with the needs of our local community and community-at-large in mind. (Intentionality; listening)*
- *Embodying the generosity of Christ, while embracing a life of trust, and thankfulness.*

Trust through Prayer: We bathe all things in prayer, trusting our Lord hears our prayers and will act and guide us in all things, knowing real world miracles do happen today.

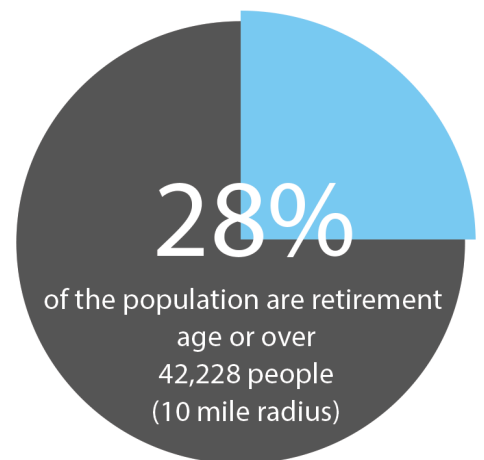
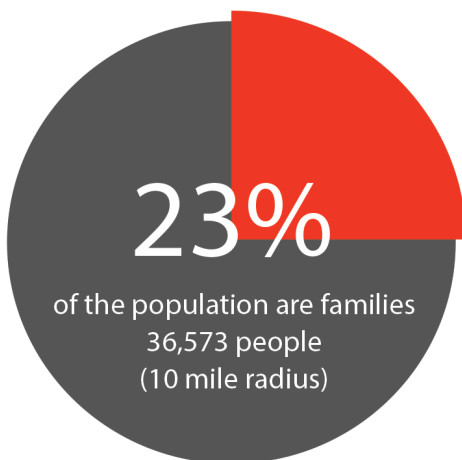

RISE OF RELIGIOUSLY UNAFFILIATED: THOSE WHO IDENTIFY AS "ATHEIST", "AGNOSTIC", OR "NOTHING IN PARTICULAR"- NOW ACCOUNT FOR NEARLY ONE-QUARTER OF AMERICANS. SINCE EARLY 1990s, THIS GROUP HAS ROUGHLY TRIPLED IN SIZE. WITHIN 10 MILES OF OUR CHURCH, 67.2% ARE NOT INVOLVED IN A RELIGIOUS COMMUNITY.

THE RELIGIOUS IDENTITY OF THE LGBT AMERICANS

LGBT individuals are far less likely to identify with any religious group than the public as a whole. Nearly half (46%) of Americans who identify as LGBT are religiously unaffiliated. They regard major faith groups to be "unfriendly" to the LGBT community.



14% of the population near us are school age children ages 5 to 17. This represents 22,568 children. (8,367 are below the age of 4 years old.)



26% of the families in our community are single mother families. That represents about 3,500 single mother families. This number is projected to increase.

These two groups represent significant opportunities for ministry. Ministry to people who are our neighbors and need support and help.

WE CARE ABOUT PEOPLE

We believe that there is no more important mission than to reach those who do not know his love and grace. Because of this, we live the love of Jesus everyday.

- Support **mission work** around the world through our generosity by tithing 15% of our offerings.
